

## Starry-eyed trio settle in

MEET three wide-eyed tawny frogmouth chicks trying to make their way in the world.

One was blown out of its nest, the other fell out while trying to fly and the third was booted out by mum.

The rag-tag trio came together at a Brisbane wildlife facility for injured birds where they will remain until they can hunt and fly.

Carer Natalie Forrest said the birds were truly nocturnal – sleeping all day and feasting at night.

The carnivorous orphans are fed a stomach-turning diet of beef heart and day-old chicks, plus vitamins and calcium.

But anyone who finds an injured bird should not attempt to feed it.

“Most likely they will be in shock so the best thing you can do is to keep them warm and call a wildlife carer,” she said.
